

Elisabetta Catelani is a Full Professor of Public Law at the University of Pisa. She holds a PhD in Public Law from the University of Florence and she has been teaching Public Law, Environmental Law, Constitutional, Comparative Law, Government Organization and Regional Law since 1989. She is currently a member of the teaching Committee of the PhD course in Legal Sciences at the University of Pisa, where she supervises PhD thesis; she was unit coordinator in several Projects of national interest financed by the Italian Ministry of University and Research.

The fields of her scientific interest are Constitutional Courts, sources of law, powers of Prime Minister and Ministers in the Italian system of government, organization of public administration, fundamental rights and social rights, in particular equal opportunities law and health law, regional law. In her research activity, she devoted great attention to the relationship between technology and politics, to Fake news *and democracy* and to the law of gender relations. She is a member of the scientific committee of legal journals and referee of many legal journals and series. She was a Chairman of the Statutory Guarantee Committee, Tuscany Region, until 2020. In June 2013, she has been appointed by the Italian Prime Minister as a member of the Constitutional Reforms Commission. She *was Legal Advisor for the Minister of the Environment (2016-2017)* and she has been a member of the Technical Committee of legislation of Marche Region since 2019. In April 2021, she became member of the Working Group appointed by the Italian Minister of Equal Opportunities and family on issues relating to gender balance in institutions, the review of appointment procedures and the evaluation of the tools introduced to promote equal opportunities. She organized and participated as a speaker at various national and international conferences. She published several articles (approximately 160), authored monographic works (e.g., *Poteri e organizzazione del governo nel contesto degli ordinamenti pluralistici contemporanei*, 2017), co-authoring and editing other books as well,
